London, Dec. 9. Yesterday Count Kinski, the Imperial Ambassador, waited on his Royal Highness Prince Frederick, and congratulated him on his safe Arrival into this Kingdom.

The British Nation have so great a Regard to Seamen and Seafaring-Men, and so desirous to have them at Home, to be ready on Occasion to serve their Country; that all Men of War, when they are abroad, have Orders to receive them on Board and bring them home: And to encourage the Merchant Ships so to do, they are allowed by Act of Parliament, for every Man Six pence a Day, till they are put on Shore in England.

Yesterday the Marquis of Caernarvon, went into waiting on his Royal Highness Prince Frederick, being appointed one of the Gentlemen of the Bed-Chamber.

Yesterday was published a Proclamation for calling the Parliament to meet, and sit for the Dispatch of Business on Tuesday the 21st of January next.

Annapolis, Feb. 24. An idle Servant belonging to Mr. Samuel Hastings, Ship-Carpenter of this Place, being seiz'd with a Fit of Laziness, absented himself from his Business for some Days; but being brought home again, his Master set him to his Sawing-Work as usual; which not agreeing with his Constitution, he chose rather to disable himself, than be oblig'd to Work, and accordingly about a Fortnight ago, he took a Broad Ax, and chopt off one of his Hands.

Capt. Daniel Watts, Commander of the Globe, arrived in Pattowmack, gives us the following Account; That on the 29th of No-

vember last, he spoke a Brigantine belonging to New-York, Andrew Bissett, Master, bound from Jamaica for London. She had been out Three Months from Jamaica; the Master and Company were all well, but their Provisions were spent. Capt. Watts spar'd her Three Weeks Provisions, and believ'd her to be not above 100 Leagues to the Westward of England. Capt. Bissett desired that might be publish'd in the News, that his Friends may be acquainted therewith.

A Ship belonging to Mr. Hunt, Merchant in London, Capt. Finch, Commander, arrived about Three Weeks since within the Capes of Virginia; but a strong North-Wind suddenly rising, drove her back to the Cape Charles, which so damaged her, when she was got off, she sunk in 7 or 8 fathom Water, as the Captain was endeavouring to run her over to James River, in order to repair her, and so suddenly, that the Master and Crew could not so much as save themselves Wearing Apparel, except that they had on their Capt. only saving one Shirt, and 2 Packs of Letters.
