

London, Dec. 72: His Majesty has been graciously pleased, to appoint his Grace Charles Duke of Bolton, Lieutenant of the County of Glamorgan, and Custos Rotulorum of the said County.

We hear his Grace the Duke of St. Alban's, will be made Cofferer to his Majesty's Household. And,

Stephen Weston, Esq; Son to the Lord Bishop of Exeter, Secretary to the Prince.

Tuesday last died the Hon. Spencer Cowper, Esq; (Brother to the late Earl Cowper) Chief Justice of Chester, and one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas, died at his Chambers in Lincoln's-Inn.

The Marquess Grimaldi, Envoy from Genoa, having taken leave of the Ministers of State, &c. will in a few Days set out for his Return home.

The Cambridge, Capt. Crocker, which is arrived in the River, left New England Oct. 31. when a Ship was arrived there from Bristol, the Master of which (named Nevell) reported, that he saw a Wreck on St. George's Bank near New England, which had a Rose in its Stern, and appeared to have been lately painted.

This Day the eldest Son of Count Kinski, the Emperor's Envoy, sets out hence for France.

The Inhabitants of Antegoa are about to make a commodious Harbour for watering, and otherwise accommodating his Majesty's Ships of War. We hear the whole Expence thereof will be 2000 l. and that his Majesty is to be one half, and the Inhabitants the other.

We hear that two Regiments of Foot are going to be sent to Gibraltar.

A Picture, curiously done from the Life, of the Prince of Nassau of Friesland, was last Week brought from Holland, and presented to their Majesties, just after they had receiv'd those of the Prince and Princess, Son and Daughter to their Prussian Majesties; which their Majesties were pleased very graciously to accept.

We hear that the Gentlemen Pensioners of the Charter-House, are to have their Pocket-Money advanced, from 6 l. per-Ann. to 10 l. and some other Regulations are to be made.

We hear that several more Men of War will be put in Commission.

We hear from Durham, that the Snow is three Foot deep in the West Country, which greatly hinders the People from coming to Market.

Annapolis, March 4. Saturday last, being the Birth Day of our most Gracious Queen Caroline, was celebrated here in the Manner following: His Excellency BENEDICT LEONARD CALVERT, our Governour, invited the Gentlemen of this City to a very handsome Entertainment at Dinner; and in the Evening, there was a Ball at the Stadthouse.
