

Annual Fishing To Demonstrate Lawn Treatment Fair Attracts Here Sept. 2 For Beetle Control Record Crowd

More than one thousand fishermen from 13 states were at Rock Hall last week end for the annual Chesapeake Bay Fishing Fair. The contests got under way at dawn Saturday and continued through Sunday. Women anglers carried off the grandprizes at this year's contest.

Mrs. Louise Kastens of Philadelphia, landed a 13-pound, 4-ounce rock and received the prize for catching the largest fish. Miss Helen J. Nikka, of Washington, D. C., won the prize for catching the largest variety of fish. Her catch included fish of seven varieties.

The fishing grounds covered a 100 square mile area between Rock Hall and Tulester. The attendance this year was double that of last season, fair officials said.

Nearly as many fishing craft and yachts as there were registered anglers crowded the little harbor and nearly 100 of the boats participated in a water carnival Sunday afternoon. The prize for the best decorated craft went to C. Markland Kelley's yacht fleet.

More than 40 vessels of the State Conservation Department underwent their annual inspection, with Capt. Frank Akers, commander of the Murray and the Chester River, won top honors.

NAMED U. OF M. TEACHER OF POULTRY HUSBANDRY

The appointment of Dr. Herbert R. Bird as associate professor of poultry husbandry was announced this week by the University of Maryland.

Dr. Bird formerly was in the bio-chemistry dept. of the University of Wisconsin, where he received his bachelor of science degree in 1933, his master's degree in 1936, and his doctor of philosophy degree this year.

During the last five years, Dr. Bird has been researching into chick nutrition and will continue that work at College Park.

Dr. E. N. Cory, State Entomologist, advises that the Japanese Beetle season is over for this year and that the traps will be taken up and stored for use another year. The fact that these traps will be kept on hand for use in the future is a warning that the beetles are still with us and that the fight must continue.

There are various methods of carrying on this fight. The most effective control method is by treating the lawns with poison, which will kill the larvae in the ground.

A demonstration of this sort, in which a lawn will be treated, will be given on the court house green tomorrow, Friday, Sept. 2, at 10 A. M. This demonstration will be directed by Forest B. Whittington, assistant entomologist from the University of Maryland.

As this demonstration is being given for the benefit of Cambridge property owners, and for all Dorchester county residents in general, all citizens are especially urged to attend this meeting and learn how the poison will be applied to be most effective.

Explains Way To Get Rid Of Pests

Along with hot weather worries and the approach of fall with its return to routine affairs is coupled another distracting event—the discovery of fleas in the home.

Often people returning from vacations find their homes literally alive with fleas. These pests also make their forays into homes when the residents are living there continuously.

These facts were brought to light by John M. Amos, Extension Entomologist at the University of Delaware, who said that requests for information about the control of fleas in homes had been received at his office in Newark in increasing quantities this month.

There are two steps in controlling these pests, he said. The first is to rid pets of adult fleas and the second is to treat the places where pets sleep or frequent in the home.

He said that the best way to rid pets of adult fleas was to bathe them in warm water in which had been added from two to four tablespoons of creolin. The animals should be thoroughly covered with the solution if it is to prove effective. Dogs should be allowed to remain wet with the solution for about fifteen minutes but should not be permitted to lick their coats. Then the dogs should be washed with soap and warm water and dried thoroughly.

Cats are sensitive to creolin dips and should be washed immediately after being taken from the solution. Amos said that creosote dips could be used in place of creolin, if desired.

Another method of treating pets for fleas is the use of pyrethrum or derris powder. This should be thoroughly dusted into the animal's fur while the pet is held over a newspaper. The fleas will drop to the paper when the fur is ruffled after the powder has been applied and then should be burned.
