We are affured by a private Letter, from Edinburgh, that Lord Loudon has received Orders to embark his Men from Cromarty, to join the Duke's Army on the Road to Invernes; and that some of the Men of War now there, will be left to keep Possession of that Haven.

That our Army at Aberdeen is furnished with two Months

Provisions; all the Store-ships being safely arrived there. And that the Army under his Royal Highness the Duke, was in high Spirits,; and was daily join'd by a great Number of Voluntiers. It is not doubted therefore, but as soon as the Weather permits, they would be able to march and dislodge the Rebels from Invernels, &c.

All the Hessians are ordered to be quartered at Stirling, Dumblane and Perth, to prevent the Return of the Rebels
