Jonniton the Gentina an at whose Request they went out) to his excellency the G ver wor's, attended by the faid foldiers, guarding the Prito ere: The Indians were all painted after their Manner for War, and continued the War Hooop all the Way; and as they paided by the Fort, they were faluted with a Dicharge of 7 Ca on His Excellency received them in a very hind obliging Man er, and after making them fuitable Presents and Thanks for entering into the War, received the Pritoners and Scalps at their House, and then dimits'd them for that time well contented : They appeared highly satisfied at their Reception; and it now appears beyond all Doubt, that if we are not wa ting to ourselves, the French would soon be convinced, that those People are still hearty Friends to the British Interest.

We have Intelligence from Boilton, that the Honourable Admiral Warren, is about to return home to Great Britain, with

all possible Expedition.
PHILADELPHIA: Dic. 2. We hear from Barbacoes, that the Trade of that place being Bill much interrupted by the French Privateers, they were obliged to agree with Capt. Fielding, of the Leoftaff Privateer, of Britol, to cruize of the Island for twelve Days, for which it is said he was to have rive Hundred Pounds; that he accordingly went out, returned the eighth Day of his Cruize, and brought in with him three of the Enemy's Privateers.
