Exercise of a Letter from Copt. Then Dutier, of the Prince William, dated Grantar, July 31

" I lere'y acquaint you of my Misfortune of being taken on the 20th Instant, in the Streights Mouth, by five Xebeque. and a back, after two Hours Engagement; four of the Xebeques boarded me with near 2000 week, and we had half an Hour's Light at close Quarters. The Enemy had in Men killed and leveral wounded, of which five died fines. I thank Gop I had not one Man killed, but had seven wounded, two of which I was obliged to leave behind in the Hospital at Ceuta, where they carried us into. They us'd as very birbarourly, and flripp'd us all quite naked. At last they gave us a rair of Trowlers, and an old Shire each, all rall of Versin, and obliged us to lie in that Condition on the Deck, which almost kill'd us. I shared the same Fate with the rest, and should have continued to, but for a good Friend, Capt. Robert Horner, the Swede. I should not have been taken, had it not been quite cam, fo that I had no Command of the Snip. My Men behav'd themselves with a deal of Courage, 'til at last we were overpowered. This Morning we got to Gibraltar, and ail my Men are put on board Ad mrail wedley."

Sept. 25. We hear that the two Ships lately arrived from Hudion's Bay, who failed with the Dobos Galley and California, from England, bring an Account, that they perted with them well the 17th of June, at Nine o' Clock at Night, in Lat. 61, 20; Long. 14, 30, from the Melician of London;

and that they had a fine open Sea, tree from ice.

The Charming Polly, Campbeil, and the Junus Carar, Fish, both from Jamaica, are taken by the French; the first is carried into St. Andero, and the latter into Monaix.

When the Party of the Irdians who lately came down here with their Priioners, first went out from the Mohawk Country, on the sculking belign, a Mohawk Indian called Hendrick, a fly aitful reslow, and one who was suspected of being in the French Interest, with his bon and several others, resolved to go out also; but took a different Course from the other Party: He nad received Presents from our Governour, and now intended to try what he could make of the French:-To this Purpose Hendrick and his Party repaired to Canada, where he was kindly received by the Governor, who was well acquainted with him; to whom he gave Intelligence of all he knew concerning the English, and related how his Nation had promited the Governor of New York to go out against the French; but affired him, that neither he nor any of their People nad any fuen Defign in Realny, any further than to amuse the English and get what they could from them. The Governor of Canada, after making 'eni fuitable Presents, and giving Hendrick and his Son a fine laced Coat, gave him some Letters to carry to Crown Point, which Hendrick promis'd faithfully to perform. While these Things were doing, Newscame to the Governor of Canada, of the Incurhous made on their People, by the other Party of our Indians: Whereupon he immediately ient for Hendrick, to know the meaning of such a carriage, telling him he had dealt unfaithfully by him: But Hendrick flood to his Integrity, amering the Governor, it could not be any of their l'eople, but muit have been some of the Southern Indians, whem the English had prevailed on to do it, and offer d to return the Letters: The Governor believing his Story, would not take the Letters, but defir'd him to carry them as before, and then difmits'd him: Hendrick then consulted with his Party; and being co-scious it could be none other than their own People, aid knowing it would foon grow too hot for them there, which the Truth came to be known fully; refolved speedily to make the best of their Way off.

Some Days after in their Way home, coming near to Fort Champice, they law feveral Frenchmen at work in the Woods, and perceiving two of them at a Distance from the rest, they furrounded them, that one of them, fealp'd him, and took the other Priloner: The Noise a'arming the others, they fied to their Arms, but in the Way foar more of their Men were shot by Hendrick's Party, who by that Time found themselves obliged in their Turn to fly, without having Leave to scalp any more or those they had killed. They afterwards fell in with a Party of French Indians, and some French Men with them, which last demanded the Pritoner of Hendrick; but was refused, and the Indians of their party would not fuster any Niolence to be done to Hendrick's Party, faying, they were not at war with one another; but only with the whites: So that Hendrick has brought the Letters, Prifoner and Scalp, along with him to Albary. This is Hendrick's Story, who fays, he had laid the Scheme in the above Manner on Purpole to annoy
