Moneur Faure says, there were 16 Sail of English in the Line, and vo others at a Diffance making towards them, some of which em'd to him as large as the Frenchmen: That the Engageent, from it's Commencement, 'til half an Hour after 9 at sight (when he was at a great Distance) appear'd to him as hot possible, there being an incessant Fire during the whole time; and then, he thinks sceas'd all at once. He feems to think, and we may reasonably hope, from the Superiority of our Force, 12t Victory declared for us, and that Admiral HAWE has cov'd them off.

We hear of one more of the French Fleet being taken, and brought into Virginia; and make no Doubt but if any English Privateers were cruifing in November and December, among the West-India Ist nds, that they found fine Picking amongst them.
