

be the greatest mortification and disappointment that can befall such an undertaking: They went out from this port before the cessation with France, and which they getting intelligence of while at sea, they bent their cruize against the Spaniards; with whom they were assured no cessation was then agreed; and indeed it cannot but be thought by common sense, to be really unjust for them to be deprived of this capture, since it was impossible for them to know of the cessation of hostilities with those people, as the proclamation was not issued in England before the 6th of August, and which was so universally unknown in America the 5th of October, that admiral Knowles on that day, very innocently, as well as very happily, gave the Spaniards a handsome *Drubanc* off the Havana, which it is probable may be the last they will receive this war. Capt. King set the Spanish captain and men ashore on Porto Rico.
