

They write from Dunkirk, that a new bason is actually sinking at Graveline, and great preparations making at that port, but for what reason is not known. The Dunkirkers however, are afraid that they shall be sufferers by this new project.

We hear that press warrants are issued out to man the guard-ships lately commission'd: And, that no further reduction in the navy or army will be made, 'til after the peace is actually signed.

Sept. 24. According to letters from Vienna by yesterday's mail, it is decided, that the Russian troops shall pass the winter in Bohemia; and that they are to be quarter'd in the circles of Saatz, Branzlau, and Koningstutz, 'til the return of the spring enables them to continue their march.

Upon the representations made to the duke of Bedford, secretary of state, by Mr. Wall, the Spanish minister, in relation to the capture of the Spanish register ship, the *Jesus Maria Joseph*, his grace gave the following answer: "That as there was not as yet any certain account come to England about this prize, at least not sufficient for him to decide on the spot, he would direct a strict enquiry to be made of the particular circumstances of that affair; and that after the most impartial examination of the whole, if the capture appeared illegal, he would not defer a moment giving orders for the restitution, to shew his Catholic majesty his sincere inclination to see friendship and perfect harmony re-established between the two nations.

We hear from Charles County, that one Mr. Harison was found dead on the Road there; and is supposed to have been kill'd by a Fall from his Horse.

The Thieves got in by breaking a large Hole through the Wall, which was of Stone: after which they made a fire in the Store with Paper (supposed to light them, very near a large Quantity of Gunpowder.
