As for Chartres, they took him to the house of one Mills, an antient fniuggler, hear Midhurst, where they kept him until Thursday (being four days after the murder of Galley; during all which time the poor man was continually praying that they would not murder him as they had done Mr. Gilley); On Thursday eighteen of them affentiled them elves at Milis's, and agreed to draw lots who should be the murgerer of Chartres: The lot failing on Berjamin Tatner, he mmediately thrust a fork into one, and then into the other of Chartres's eyes, the last of which fell on his cheek. After some time, Thiner cut. off Chartres's note and privy parts, the space of time between each operation being ball an hour, scoffing and jeering the unhappy man during all the time of his fufferings; who returned them no other language, but only, Pray, gentlemen, spare me my life. The villains, after committing these barba ous acts, threw him down a well, while living, and cover'd him with

The perions to be tried for the above murders are eight, three of whom were brought here of Friday left from London, and five from Horsham, Mills and his son being two of them; two of the gang, Steel and Rosse, being the king's winesix; who are all that are taken.
