the French transports in three or four days time.

The same day Capt. Foster arrived here in ten days from Chebucta, by whom we are inform'd, that the people there are plentifully supplied with fresh provisions by the French inhabirants, and that they go on brifkly in clearing the land, and pre-paring of frames for houses.—That governor Mascarine, and other gentlemen from Annapolis, were arrived at Chebucta; and that Capt. Rous in the Albany, and Capt. Pearle in the Boston, were gone to St. John's, to disturb the French in the fettlements they are making there.

William Massarve, master of the sloop Success, is larely arrived at the port of Pilcataqua from Antigua, with a confiderable

quantity of flour lately purchased there.
