Gales, not having Time to flow away their Cab'es; and the Seas continually breaking over them to the 16th at Night, when it became ca'm for about three Hours; during which Time they stow'd away their Cables, and then came on another violent torm. On the 17th, in Lat. 36, 46, and Long 71, 40, they found some of her Seams parted, and the Vessel very leaky. On the 29 h, in Lat. 36, 3, and Long. 61, 24, there are e the most terrible Storm they had ever seen, the Wind at N. by W. which carried away their Bowiprit, and obliged them to lie to under their bare Poles; and at 3 o'Clock at Night, by one Sea they loft their Mail, Rudder, Sails, Boat, Guns, Camboufe, Binnacle, and Water Cask, having nothing left on the Dick, but one spare Yard and the Tiller; they had nx reet Water in the Hold, and in the Cabin and Steerage it was breast high, they expecting every Moment to fink: As foon as she righted a little, being lightened by the falling of the Mast, they got to work at the Pumps, and with much Labour kept her up. On the 30th in the Morning four of the Mon were walled overboard at once, one of whom (James H.li) was drowned, and the other three thrown on board again by the Waves; tho' one of them was curried to a confiderable Distance from the V stel, and toss's about by the Sea near 15 Minutes. After this Accident, they ook'd upon themselves as inevitably lost, and finking; but by throwing out some of the Corn, and working at the Pumps, on the tilt of January they feem'd to have gain'd of the Water. Their Provision in this their Diffress, for acout a Forteight, was raw Beef and Fork: they lay in this Condition, without Math, Sails, Rueder, &c. 'til the 8th of April, when having made a fort of Rucder of fome Pine Plank, which cost them fix Wetks Work, and fix'd up a small Sail, they got her to sleer on the 10th; and judging that they were nearest to the Coast of Ireland, and the Wind proving Westerly, they sheered for that Coall; for she would theer only before the Wino. Thus they went flowly on 'til the 31 of June, when they arrived at the Island of Tyrie, in the Highlands of Scotland; where having made a kind of Mast. they attempted three feveral Times to get out ir in the ice, but were as often beat back on the Rocks: At length, on the 24th of September they got out, intending for Civile, or the Coast of Irelard, where they might refit; but were griv n into Oban in the Highlands; and the Scalon of the Year neing far spent, it became dangerous to proceed any farther in the Condition they were in; so that having got Carpenters and Materials from Greenock, and reflitted, they proceeded to Greenock, where they arrives the 25th of March 1ait, and loaded with I obacco for France,; from wheree they came hither, being all the fame Hands that went out from hence in December 1747, except Hands that went out from hence in December 1747, except Hall who was drowned as above related. They faw James Hall, who was drowned as above related. They faw ieveral Vesiels at Sea, while they were in Diffress, and were very near some of them, but met with no Assauce from any They were much put to it for Water, having none for a long Time but what Rain Water they caren'd as it run off the Quarter Deck. Their Bedding and Cloaths were all rotten, the Vessel being twice overser, and their Chests stove to
