

Gales, nor having Time to stow away their Cab'es; and the Seas continually breaking over them to the 16th at Night, when it became calm for about three Hours; during which Time they stow'd away their Cab'es, and then came on another violent Storm. On the 17th, in Lat. 36, 46, and Long. 71, 40, they found some of her Searas parted, and the Vessel very leaky. On the 29th, in Lat. 36, 3, and Long. 61, 24, there arose the most terrible Storm they had ever seen, the Wind at N. by W. which carried away their Bow-sprit, and obliged them to lie to under their bare Poles; and at 3 o'Clock at Night, by one Sea they lost their Mast, Rudder, Sails, Boat, Guns, Cambouse, Binnacle, and Water Cask, having nothing left on the Deck, but one spare Yard and the Tiller; they had six Feet Water in the Hold, and in the Cabin and Steerage it was breast high, they expecting every Moment to sink: As soon as they got a little, being lightened by the falling of the Mast, they got to work at the Pumps, and with much Labour kept her up. On the 30th in the Morning four of the Men were wash'd overboard at once, one of whom (*James Hill*) was drowned, and the other three thrown on board again by the Waves; tho' one of them was carried to a considerable Distance from the Vessel, and tosh'd about by the Sea near 15 Minutes. After this Accident, they look'd upon themselves as inevitably lost, and sinking; but by throwing out some of the Corn, and working at the Pumps, on the 1st of *January* they seem'd to have gain'd of the Water. Their Provision in this their Distress, for about a Fortnight, was raw Beef and Fork; they lay in this Condition, without Mast, Sails, Rudder, &c. till the 8th of *April*, when having made a sort of Rudder of some Pine Plank, which cost them six Weeks Work, and fix'd up a small Sail, they got her to steer on the 10th; and judging that they were nearest to the Coast of *Ireland*, and the Wind proving Westerly, they steer'd for that Coast; for she would steer only before the Wind. Thus they went slowly on till the 31 of *June*, when they arriv'd at the Island of *Tyrie*, in the Highlands of *Scotland*; where having made a kind of Mast, they attempted three several Times to get out from thence, but were as often beat back on the Rocks: At length, on the 24th of *September* they got out, intending for *Cole*, or the Coast of *Ireland*, where they might rest; but were driv'n into *Oban* in the Highlands; and the Season of the Year being far spent, it became dangerous to proceed any farther in the Condition they were in; so that having got Carpenters and Materials from *Greenock*, and refitted, they proceeded to *Greenock*, where they arriv'd the 25th of *March* last, and loaded with Tobacco for *France*; from whence they came hither, being all the same Hands that went out from hence in *December* 1747, except *James Hall*, who was drowned as above related. They saw several Vessels at Sea, while they were in Distress, and were very near some of them, but met with no Assistance from any of them. They were much put to it for Water, having none for a long Time but what Rain Water they catch'd as it run off the Quarter Deck. Their Bedding and Cloaths were all rotten, the Vessel being twice overfet, and their Chelts stove to pieces.

At the Assizes for this County, which ended yesterday, one *Charles Elliott* was tried, convicted, and received Sentence of Death, for stealing a Mare.
