carred to fire in order to be thawed, before taken to market. And yet, what is very furpriling, the coins have a fine appearance, but the froit on the trees has suffered confiderably.

Chibusta, (in Nova Scotia) August 23, 1749.

Fisce of the chiefs of the St. John's Indians were here not long fince, and ratified the peace made at Annapolis before the French war, and are gone home in the Anfon galley, and teem to be peaceable and easy. The Mickmucks, or Cape-Sabe ledians, have been here cally in great numbers, trad ng in a river, they infulted a boat with fome of our people, by rushing to them with a great body, as foon as the boat firuck the those, and took two of the arms, and fired them off, then took the oars, and ran into the woods; but the corporal who commanded the boat, being a resolute man, he pursued them, and wrelled both the arms and oars from them, and returned: Up on this the Indians all drew off, which we fince understand they were ordered to do by their pricit, with some other remote tribes, to a place of rendezvou; which we imagine is to confule fonce means to annoy us and the fettlers here, being infligated by the French inhabitants, who fince the discovery of his maje. ii)'s infructions to them, I believe will take all methods to pre-vent a Briath government here, they being obliged to tweat full allegiance to his Britannic majetty, form themselves into a regular militia, and give all affilhance in arms whenever called, or move off, without liberty to fell, or even to do the least anmage to their lands or houles, which they are to give a peren.pto y answer to in three months: They have therefore lent of paches to the governors of Canada and Louisbourg for advice, and it is generally thought many will quit, which will leave fine p. ff ffions for good loyal fut je cts.

Capt. Joleph Gorham, in a well armed floop, is ordered by the governour to cruize along the shore as far as the bay Vert, to dat but e his excellent y's proclamation to all the harbours inhibited, with power to be zetall yessels that shall be sound carrying provinors from this province to other colonie, especially to Luisbourg, and to make what discoveries he can of the cesses of the inhabitants and Indians. It is thought he will cruize as sar as Louisbourg, there being several shallops from thence at Canso, cutting of hay, and it is not doubted he will soon give a good account of them.

There are five picket forts building on the back of the town of Halliax, which will be garr foned with Warburton's regiment, Col. Gorham's company, for the fecurity of the fettle's. Governor Fichion with his regiment, (in five ships) failed for England the 19th instant.

ANNAPOLIS.

On the Eleventh Instant Died, at his Seat on Wye-River in Queen Anne's County, RICHARD BERNETT, Elq; in the Eighty-third Year of his Age, generally, mented by all that knew him. As his grear Fortune enabled him to do much good, so (happily for many) his Inclination was equal to his Ability, to and delirested, where he did very liberally,

were. As he was the greatest Trader in this Province, so great. Numbers sell in his Debt, and a more merciful Creditor could not be, having never deprived the Wieows or Orphans of his Debtors of a Support; and when what the Debtors lest, was not sufficient for that purpose, frequently supply'd the deficiency. His long Experience and great Knowlege in Bosiness, as well as his known Candor and generally, occasion'd many to apply to him for Advice and Affistance, and none were ever-disappointed of what was, in his Power, and several were by his means, extricated out of great Difficulties. He was always solicitous to prevent Deferences among his Neighbours, and to reconcile such as he could not prevent. In ther, nothing gave him so thuch pleasure as doing humane and benevolent Actions; and it may be truly affirm'd, that by his Death, the poor and needy have less their greatest Friend and Benefactor.

Last sa urday came up the Bay to this Place the Sloop Hope I well, Capt. Strachan, who fail'd a few Weeks fince for Barbados; but meeting with excellive hard Weather about 50 Leagues from the Capes, and springing a Leak, was obliged to re urn, and put into Norfolk in Virginia, where Capt. Stracban fold her Lading, and came back to this Place. He brings a melarcholy Account of a Storm which happened very lately and has done incredible Damage rear the Mouth of our Bay. On Sarurday Evening, the 7th of this Instant, he being then as Norfolk, the Wind began to blow hard, and about one or two in the Morning was very violent at N. B. with Rain, and flilk kept increasing; but the most violent of the Storm was from ten 'il two on Sunday. The Tide rose 15 Feet perpendicular higher than usual, forcing Ships and other Vessels ashore where, the Water was never before known to flow; many of which are now fo far from the Water, and some of them loaded, that it will coll as much as they are worth to get them effoat again. if it be prochicable: Several new Ships were carried off the Stocks; all the Wharffs, and feveral Warehouses were carried away. A Warehouse of Col. Tucker's, 60 Feet by 30, having in it 90 Pipes of Wine and 40 Hogheads of Rum on the lower Floor, and a Quantity of Corn and Oats in the Loft, was taken off it's Foundation, carried a Mile and a half from the Place where it flood, and landed upright on the other Side of the River, without any Damage to what was in it; this Warehouse passed by the Hopewell, the Eaves of it being about four Feet above Water, and touch'd her Quarter, without doing any Hurt. Whars with Archors lying on them of 1000 16. Weight, were seen floating on the Water, and were carried away bodily, Stones and Timber together; and the River was a most covered with Lumber, Masts, Yards, Bales, Casks, &c. And by a Letter from a Gentleman at Norfolk we are informed, that the Damage there amounts to upwards of 30,000 / Some Gentlemen now at Norfolk, who were in Jamaica when the lust great Hurricane happened there, which destroyed several Men of War, &c. say it was not so violent as this. Tho Tide kept continuously fluxing, and rum at the Rate of five Miles an Hour; it overflowed all their Streets, carried fome small Crass near a Mile from the ordinary High Water Mark, and left some of them in the Corn Fields, we

At Hampton much Damage is likewise done: A noted Tavern there, kept by Mrs. Hawkini (who gave Name to Mother Hawkini's Hole), was 8 Feet in Water; and a Yawl was paddled through the Passage of the House. A little on this Side of Hampton, as a Place called Back River, three Families it is said, were drowned, the Men, Wives, and Children.

In Worcester County, in this Province; the Tide rose to a prodig our Height, and has done considerable Damage; Capt. Newbold's Sloop is now lying high and dry in an Apple Orcharo: And the Losses suitained there, in drowning of Cattle, Horses, &c. are very great. The Sea broke over an Island in the said County, called Phanix Island, on which were between 4 and 500 Head of Cattle, and 60 Horses; whereby all the Cattle were drowned but sive, and all the Horses except one. The Damage in Worcester County, is computed at about 10,000 l.

Three Vessels are assore at the Capes; and at Norfolk very, few rode it out.
