Several persons concerned in transporting the woollen manufactures to Spain, were re examined, when two of them were admited to bail, but the principal persons were ordered to be continued in close custody. At the same time a person coveried in the above transaction and who had been some time upon bail, was ordered into close custody of a messenger.
