But however justly the several Regulations in this Law may be calculated for the Interest of the Planter, a great deal, as I formerly observed to you, must always depend upon the due Execution of it; therefore I cannot but earnessly recommend this again to your Confideration, that the reasonable Hopes we have of the future Prosperity of our Trade, may not be in any Degree frustrated by any Want of Care and Attention in ourselves.

As to my own Part, you may be affured of my fincere Defire to promote your Happiness in every Respect: It is not only my Inclination, but I look upon it as my Duty, and shall ever think myself happy in Proportion to the Benefit the Public may reap from my Administration.

There are my real Sentiments, and I can truly fay, that I have never recommended any Thing to you, but what I fincerely thought for your Interest; even the Three Pence per Hogshead for Arms and Ammunition, which the Duty of my Station must always oblige me to press in a particular Manner, concerns the Government no further, than as it is necessary for the Safety and Defence of the Province, which every Man of Property in the Country is essentially interested in,

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
