THE JUDGMENT.

The question of the election of a Chief Judge to supply the vacancy which will exist after the 19th of July next when Judge Yokell will retire at the age of 70 years, is fast becoming the serious attention of the people of Baltimore county. Another contingency exists in the market, that of the candidacy of Mr. N. Charles Barker for Associate Judge, in the event of the nomination of Judge Fowler for Chief Judge, or his appointment by Governor Jackson after July 19th until the election, to fill the vacancy that may exist.

Mr. William S. Keech, who is a candidate for Chief Judge, stated that he will not take part in the Democratic primaries unless they are held after the 19th of July, and after Gov. Jackson shall have made his appointment of some person as Chief Judge until the election. Mr. Keech makes a further condition, that the Convention to nominate county officers shall be held before the Judicial primaries; and he will not even then go into the primaries unless he shall have irrefragable evidence that there will be absolute fairness in every respect, otherwise he will announce himself as a candidate for Chief Judge subject to the decision of the people at the election in November.

The State Convention of the Baltimore Convention to be held on the 7th of August, and the primaries will therefore be held about the last week of July.

Whether the County Convention to nominate county officers will be held before the Judicial primaries, is not yet known, as no meeting of the Democratic Executive Committee has been held.

Although it is rumored that Gov. Jackson will not make any appointment of a Chief Judge for the term between the 19th of July and the election, nothing definite is known upon the subject.

A statement in the Baltimore Sun of the 15th inst. that the Republicans are willing to make a deal with a Democrat for Chief Judge, provided he will form a coalition including a Republican for Associate Judge, does not apply to Mr. Keech.

SECRETARY NOBLE IS RIGHT.
