TARIFF REFORM CLUB FORMED AT TOWSON.

On Tuesday night, 14th inst., pursuant to a call, there was a meeting of persons interested in the subject of tariff reform held at the Court House, Towson, and a strong Club was organized. Mr. James E. Green called the meeting to order, and on motion Mr. Washington Stevenson was elected President, and Mr. S. C. Tomay, Secretary.

Mr. Green in calling the meeting to order explained the object of the gathering to be for the purpose of forming an organization for the discussion of tariff reform and furthering the views of the great principles as enunciated by Grover Cleveland.

Mr. Stevenson in taking the chair said he was only a plain farmer and had come out to hear this matter discussed in which the whole community is so much interested, and he thanked the gentlemen present for the honor they had conferred on him.

Dr. T. K. Worthington, of Maryland Tariff Reform Club of Baltimore, then addressed the assembly and explained the object of the Club and the necessity for the dissemination of articles pertaining to tariff reform.

Mr. Roger W. Cull followed with a spirited and stirring address, and gave many lucid points in explanation of the tariff reform. He pointed out the whole country and the dire straits laid upon the great majority of the people by this falsely called high protection tariff.

Mr. Chas. E. Fendall was called on and made a short address. He said that a great deal of interest in the subject had been kindled and he hoped that the people would take as much interest in tariff reform as they do in the road question.

NORRHEM CENTRAL ELEVATOR

Monday evening, 13th inst., fire was discovered in the grain elevator at Canton, on the Northern Central Railway at Canton, and the immense structure was destroyed, with about 500,000 bushels of wheat and corn, involving a total loss of over a million dollars, with an insurance of \$175,000 on the elevator building.

The fire broke out at about 10 o'clock, and a large iron steamship, the Sacabosco, lying at the wharf to be loaded with grain, was also burned, and the bodies were found between decks. The elevator was under lease to the Baltimore Elevator Company. All the wood work of the Sacabosco, down to the water's edge, was burnt, and the vessel was hauled off and beached at Point Breeze.

The pier and trestle was also insured to the amount of \$45,000. For two or three hours the fire was plainly visible at Towson, the immense light being reflected. It is stated that the burning corner made a tremendously hot fire.

The Baltimore County Council Fire Engine at Highland Park materially assisted in saving contiguous property near the burning mass.
