THE AUSTRALIAN BALLOT LAW. Instructions to Voters in Preparing and Casting Their Ballots.

In accordance with Australian Ballot Law, passed at the session of the Legislature last winter, Hon. E. W. LeCompte, Secretary of State, has issued the following instructions to voters, who are to prepare and cast their ballots.

1. Any person desiring to vote must enter the voting booth at the residence, or at the polling place, at the time specified in the instructions.

2. After receiving the ballot the voter must examine it carefully, and be satisfied that it is correct. If it is not correct, he may return it to the clerk before he has cast it.

3. The voter must mark his ballot in private, and no person shall be permitted to see him while he is doing so.

4. The voter must fold his ballot so that his name and the names of the candidates shall not be visible.
