

Gouvernement made in the year and thousand six hundred fifty two to
banished or hereafter made incapable of Electing or to be elected to all
future Assemblies -

That no Act or order of Assembly or Courts within this Province
made or past since the year one thousand six hundred fifty four in
causes of *modum et tuum* shall be declared void by pretence of
Irregularity of the power of Government established in the year one
thousand six hundred fifty and four -

5^{ly} That all such as shall within six months after the date hereof come
or send to the Secretarys office and therd according to conditions of
Plantations make their Right appear shall have warrant granted
for so much land as they shall make appear to be due and the same
land by them Entred upon by virtue of Grants entered in County or
Provinciall Courts Provided such lands be not formerly taken up by
Lawfull Warrant from his Lordships officers nor reserved for his Lordships
use,

6^{ly} That the Oathe of fidelitie shall not be prested upon the people non
resident within this Province but instead and place thereof An
Engagement to take and subscribe in manner and forme following
Viz.

I. A. B. Do promise and Engage to Submitt to the Authority of the
Right Honble Cecilius Lord Baltimore and his heires within this
Province of Maryland according to his Patent of the said Province
And to his present Lieutenant and other officers here by his Lordship
appointed to whom I will be ayding and Assisting and will not
abide or assist any here in opposition to them -

7^{ly} Lastly that no person whatsoeuer within this Province shall (by any
Colour or suggestion) be disarmed or dispoysed in his Armes or Ammunition
(and thereby consequently left to the cruelty of the Indians) unless such
person be proved to bear Armes to an hostile intent or contrary to
the usuall and allowable custome of the Country for such mans defence
This present Generall Assembly having Considered the present state of this
Province and finding the Agreement according to the said Articles greatly
conducing to the honour of the Province and the peace of the Province
As also tending to th
