Any Traynering Mustering daies for militarye concernement or election of
Burgesss or Councillor that it shall and may be lawfull for the Sheriff or
any other officer to apprehend and carry to prison any person or persons for
Ryots felonie or suspicion of Felony or for escapers out of Prison when under
exection upon any day att any place any thing in this Act to the Contrarie
Notwithstanding Provided also that it may be Lawfull for any Sheriff to
Arrest any person or persons att a Mustering day that is not bound to attend the
Mustre there to exercice and prayne And this Act to Continue for three yeards or
to the end of the next Generall Assembly —

(An) Act for Amerciaments in the Provinceall & County Courts
Whereas many suiter and payed upon frivoles occasions by litigious persons for
prevention thereof for the future Bee it Enacted by the Right Honourable the
Lord Proprietary by and with the Consent of the Upper and Lower House of this present
Generall Assembly that all persons whatsover that are cast in any cause be they
Plt. or Def. shall be amerced (bordes the damages and cost to the Recoverour) fifty
pounds of Tobacco in the Provinciall Court to be employed as the Gouernour and Council
shall thinke. And in the County Courts thirty pounds of Tobacco to be Employed as the
Commissioners shall think fit. For the due collecting whereof Bee it Enacted by the
Authority aforesaid that the Clerkes of the Provinciall Courts and the severall County
Courts keep an Exact Account of the Amerciaments and deliver or send the same
to the severall Sheriffs of the particular Countys who are hereby required to
Collect the same with the Leavys and are accordingly Impowred for default of
Payment to make distresses and command not to Return any Arrears (Executors
& Administrators who cannot pay without orderr alwayes Excepted) And be it
further Enacted That the Clerkes of the Respective Courts shall give unto the
chief Judge of every Court a list of the Amerciaments that Court Imposeth this
Act to continue for three yeares or to the next Generall Assembly —

(An) Act for the Repeale of an act made Anno 1661 Entituled
an Act concerning killing wild Cattle —

Whereas sundry Inhabitants of this Province finding themselves much grieved
being restrainid by vertue of that Act made at St. Johns the Seventeenth of April
one thousand six hundred Sixty one by Phillip Calvert Esq: intituled an Act concerning
killing wild Cattle whereby all persons having any marked Cattle amongst wild
Cattle cannot presume to kill their owne marked Cattle att any tym of the yeare
for their owne service. And therfore pray that it may be Enacted And Bee it
Enacted by the Right hon: the Lord Proprietary by and with the Consent of the
Upper and Lower House of this present Generall Assembly That this Act concerning
killing wild Cattle be and is hereby utterly abrogated for ever —
