

This Generall Assembly That the Hon^{ble} the Lieutenant Generall for the time being doo chuse and appoint such person or persons from time to time to be Coroners as he shall Judge most able and best qualified for that office in each respective County in this Province And Bee it further Enacted that the Lieutenant Generall give out Comissions to such persons to the Intent and purpose as aforesaid And that the same as neede as may be may concure with the Laws and Constitutions of England And that an Oath be administered to everie such Coroner by appointment of the Lieutenant Generall att their Entring into thd said Office according to the forme of the Oath of a Coroner in England -

An Act for Confirmation of the Articles of Peace made with the Indians

Whereas by Articles of peace drawn and concluded on by the grand Committee of both houses of this present Generall Assembly and the twentieth day of Aprill one thousand six hundred sixty six signed by the Hon^{ble} the Gouverneur and as many of the great men of Bassettaway, Anacostaneck, Doager, Mikikiwoman, Manasquashon, Mattawoman, Chingua, Wateick, Mangmaick, Portoback, Sacayo, Bangayo and Chopticoe as were present with a limitation of time for the Absents to come in and signe the said Articles after peace and Amity was and is concluded on much for the common good and security of the people of this Province and the Honour of the Lord Proprietaray with the advice and consent of the upper and lower house of this present Generall Assembly That the aforesaid Articles dated the twentieth of Aprill one thousand six hundred Sixty Six be Inuolably kept and preserved according to the true intent purport and meaning of them and for the preservation of the people of this Province and honor of his lordship and the English Nation which will undoubtedly suffer by breach of faith even to a Heathen

Whereras divers masters and Merchants of Ships and other Vessells trading into this Province doo purchase great quantities of Tobacco and afterwards employ the same Tobacco in buying Commodities Imported and either sell the said Commodities to the Inhabitants of this Province att Excessive Rates or Export the said Commodities to the great losse damage and detriment of the Inhabitants of this Province Bee it therefore enacted by the Right Hon^{ble} the Lord Proprietaray and with the advice and assent of the upper and lower house of this present Generall Assembly That no person or persons be trading as aforesaid with this Province Shall buy and sell again or transpor-
ting such goods Imported Commodities and other Merchandise and apparel upon the penalty of forfeiting all such goods for the value thereof the one halfe to
