

This Generall Assembly That the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lieutenant Generall for the time being doo chuse and appoint such person or persons from time to time to be Coroners as he shall judge most able and best qualified for that office in each respective County in this Province. And Be it further Enacted that the Lieutenant Generall give out Comissions to such persons to the Intent and purpoſe as aforesaid And that the same as neare as may be may concuer with the Laws and Constitutions of England And that an Oath be administered to every Such Coroner by appointment of the Lieutenant Generall att their Entring into the ſaid office according to the forme of the Oath of a Coroner in England —

An Act for Confirmation of the Articles of Peace made with the Indians

Whereas by Articles of peace drawn and concluded on by the grand Committee of both houses of this present Generall Assembly and the twentieth day of Aprill one thousand six hundred fifty six signed by the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Gouvernor and as many of the great men of Passcattaway, Anacostaneck, Doager, Mikikiwoman, Marasquand, Mattawoman, Chingwa, Wateick, Mangamuck, Portoback, Sacayo, Bangayo and Hopticod as were preſent with a limitation of time for the Absents to come in and ſigne the ſaid Articles after preade and Amity was and is concluded on much for the common good and Securitie of the people of this Province and the Honour of the Lord Proprietor with the advice and consent of the upper and lower house of this present Generall Assembly That the aforesaid Articles dated the twentieth of Aprill one thousand six hundred Sixty Six be Inevolably kept and preſerved according to the true intent purpoſe and meaning of them and for the preſervation of the people of this Province and honour of his lordship and the English Nation which will undoubtedly ſuffer by breach of faith even to a Heathen

An Act prohibiting Foreign Ingrefers

Wherda divers masters and merchants of Ships and other vefſells trading into this Province doo purchase great quantities of Tobacco and afterwards employ the ſame Tobacco in buying Commodities Imported and either ſell the ſaid Commodities to the Inhabitants of this Province at Exceeded Rates or Export the ſaid Commodities to the great losse damage and detriment of the Inhabitants of this Province. Bee it therefore enacted by the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Proprietor and with the advice and affent of the upper and lower house of this present Generall Assembly That no person or persons do bring as aforesaid into this Province Shall buy and ſell again or transvey any ſuch goods Imported Commodities and other vefſells not approved upon the penaltie of forfiting all ſuch goods to the value thereof the one halfe to
