

This Generall Assembly That the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lieutenant Generall for the tyme being  
 doo constitute and appoint such person or persons from tyme to tyme to be Coroners  
 as he shall Judge most able and best qualified for that office in each respective  
 County in this Province And Be itt further Enacted that the Lieutenant Generall  
 give out Comissions to such persons to the Intent and purpose as aforesaid And  
 that the same as need as may be may Concurr with the Lawes and Constitutions  
 of England And that an Oath be administr'd to every such Coroner by appoint-  
 =ment of the Lieutenant Generall at their Entering into the said office according  
 to the forme of the Oath of a Coroner in England -

An Act for Confirmation of the Articles of Peace made with the  
 Indians

Whereas by Articles of peace drawn and concluded on by the grand Committee of  
 both houses of this present Generall Assembly and the twentieth day of Aprill one  
 thousand six hundred sixty six signed by the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Governour and as many of  
 the great men of Pascatoway, Anacostanek, Doagor, Mikikiwoman, Marasquodone  
 Mattawoman, Chingwa, Waterick, Mangemaick, Portoback, Sacayo, Bangayo and  
 Chopticoe as were present with a limitation of tyme for the Absents to come in  
 and signe the said Articles a firm peace and Amity was and is concluded on  
 much for the common good and security of the people of this Province and the  
 Honour of the Lord Proprietary with the advice and Consent of the upper and  
 lower house of this present Generall Assembly That the aforesaid Articles dated  
 the twentieth of Aprill one thousand six hundred sixty six be Inviolably  
 kept and preserved according to the true intent purpose and meaning of them  
 and for the preservation of the people of this Province and honor of his Lordship  
 and the English Nation which will undoubtedly suffer by breach of faith even  
 to a Heathen

Whereas divers masters and Merchants of Shippes and other vessells trading  
 into this Province doo purchase great quantities of Tobacco and afterwards  
 employ the same Tobacco in buying Commodities Imported and either sell the  
 said Commodities to the Inhabitants of this Province at Excessive Rates or  
 Export the said Commodities to the great loss damage and detriment of the  
 Inhabitants of this Province Be itt therefore Enacted by the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup>  
 the Lord Proprietary and with the advice and Assent of the upper and  
 lower house of this present Generall Assembly That no person or persons be  
 trading as aforesaid into this Province shall buy and sell again or transport  
 any such goods Imported Provisions and other necessaries unless they be  
 upon the penalty of forfeiting all such goods & the value thereof the one halfe to
