 divers old Laws not sufficiently providing against the offences by them to be
 punished have been made more penal To the end many people of this Province
 evilly disposed may be deterred from evill doing And that notwithstanding
 all the Laws intend that every person in this Province is bound to take notice —
 of what is passed in this Assembly because every person is there present in —
 their representations yett your Lordships two houses of Assembly very well —
 knowing that your Lordship desires not the destruction of the very worst of the
 people of this Province nor that they should be overtaken by an intendment in
 Law in a penall Act though not at all too severe for the misdeeds it intends
 to punish doe pray that it may be Enacted And Be it Enacted by the Right
 Honble the Lord Proprietary with the advice and consent of this present Generall
 Assembly That from henceforward all the acts that shall passe from this
 and all other succeeding Assemblies shall be from tyme to tyme fairely transcribed
 into parchment And by writt under the great seal of this Province from time
 to time to be passed by the Chancellor for the tymes then being to the Sheriffs —
 of each respective County to be transmitted and commandement to them in the said writt
 shall be given as well the said Acts in their severall and respective Countys in
 what places to them shall seeme most convenient to publish and Proclaim as —
 the said Acts of Assembly to be firmly observed and kept and be it further
 Enacted that every Proprietary and Proprietarie County shall from tyme to tyme
 pay unto the Chancellor for the tymes then being for such transcript of the —
 Laws and writt under the great seal as aforesaid the sume of two thousand —
 pounds of Tobacco
