And Exceutors so long as he or they shall Inhabite within this Province And
Provided also that such as shall be found by proof or other Circumstances wilfully
to absent themselves into the woods or else where from the Sheriffs sight where
they cannot be found to be brought to any all and such also as shall be intended
to depart or fly out of the Province (to be avoided upon oath) shall have no
Benefitt of this Law but that an attachment or Exceution may Issue forth on all
or any of his or their goods or Chattels This act to endure for three yeares or to the
End of the next Generall Assembly which shall first happen —

An Act for Recording the Journall — of the Lower house —

Whereas it is thought good for the Benefitt and Enlightning of future Assembly
That a Record be kept of all proceedings that shall passe in the Lower house of
Assembly in this Province be it therefore Enacted by the Right Hon. the Lord
Proprietary of this Province by and with the advice and Consent of the upper
Lower house of this present Generall Assembly That the Clerks of the Lower house
of Assembly for the time being transcribe the said Journall within two monthes
after the dissolution Prorogation or adjournment of the said Assembly and
deliver the same into the Secretaries office upon the penalty of five hundred pounds
of Tobacco to the Lord Proprietary and the Loss of his Salary for his services in
the Assembly the said fine and forfeitures to be Levied upon the said Clerks
by the Appointment of the Lieutenant Generall or Governour of this Province
for the time being upon Certificate from the Secretary of this Province for the
time being that the said Journall as aforesaid is not by the said Clerks of the Lower
house delivered into the Secretaries office as aforesaid —

And it is hereby further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid that the Secretary
of the Province for the time being shall be Enjoynd to examine the Secretaries office
touching the purport of this Act and make Certificate to the Governour or Lieutenant
Generall for the time being That thereby the fine and forfeitures aforesaid may the
more duly be Levied —

An Act Providing what shall be good Evidence — to prove forrigne debts —

Whereas divers persons in the Kingdom of England and other places have in their
hands bonds of divers and sundry persons now Residing in this Province and
send them to certain Attorneys here to be put in Suite against the debtors here
which for want of a Law to Explain and ascertain what shall be a sufficient
proof and Evidence for the proving the said bonds to be the Act and
deed of the debtor and by them to be Sealed and delivered Neither is there
any
