The humble Petition of Phillip Calvert Your Lordshipp's Judge in Probatorie causes & John Jordan the two overseers of the last will of Revd C^o John Garboe late deceased —

I sheweth

That the said John Garboe in the yeare of our Lord one thousand six hundred Seventy one being sick made his Testament in writing by which he Divideth his lands amongst all his Children then borne That Recouering of that sicknesse he lived till he had another sonne & daughter borne And in the yeare of our Lord 1674 falling sick againe the said John Jordan That upon thursday morning the fourth of March 1674 he came to the house of Revd Collell John Garboe and finding him sick the said John Jordan advised the said Garboe to Settle his affaires that his wife and Children might not after his death bee putt to trouble Whereupon the said Garboe desired the said Jordan to send for Mr Edward Clarke to come to him on Friday Morning following to make his will and said he did intende to alter his will made somwhat before because he had some Children borne since the making the said will and that in regard his daughter had some land to be madd good to her by Marks, Orde and Wulfrid Hull gentleman he was Resolved to have his owne land now divided betwixen his three Sonnes vizt to John Garboe the Seate of Land wher he then lived with one Negro together with his Right to one hundred & fifty Acres of the mill land wher William Middleby lived and the millstones Exchanged with the said William for the one hundred & fifty acres wher the said William now liveth as also one Equall share with his Brothers Sister and mother of the Cattle Horses Mares Household Stuffe To Peter Garboe the three hundred Acres of Land bought or Exchanged with Henric Aspinall by St Lawrence Crofts in Brittains Bay with one Negro & an Equall share of the Cattle Horses and Mares Mowables To Henric Garboe five hundred Acres in the Branches of St Lawrence Crofts one Negro & an Equall share of the Cattle Horses Mares Household Stuffe or mowables To Mary Garboe his Daughter the Silver Tankard & his Silver Spoones one Negro & an Equall share of Cattle Horses Mares Household Stuffe or mowables To Mary Garboe his wife the man with one eye the old woman called Cud & Athon by Name & an Equall share of the Mowables & only the mare Bonnie & her colt of the Horses
