

Secretary's Office for the full Space of three whole months, and that if in that
tyme no person shall underwrit the person respectively so being, up his name as
afforded, It shall then be lawfull for the Governor, Chancellor or Secretary of
this Province for the tyme being to sign a pass to any such person to depart this
Province for which pass the party shall pay to the person signing the same the
Sum of two shillings and six pence Sterling,

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid That any Master of
Horses or vassals, or other persons whatsoever that shall Transport or convey
out of this Province by land or water any freeman being indebted by Bill Bond
accident or otherwise unto any Inhabitant without such pass under the hand of the
Governour Chancellor or Secretary of this Province for the tyme being as aforesaid
Shall be lyable to Satisfie all such debts, engagments and damages to the person
or persons to whom such debt or Damages respectively shall be due within this
Province except the same be otherwise satisfied in some convenient tyme or that
in one month he cause or procure such freeman to return again to this
Province whereby he may be lyable to Justice here, And every such person as
aforesaid as shall Transport or convey away out of this Province any Servant
or Servants being Servants hereby Condition for wages Indenture or custome
of the Countrey shall be lyable to pay and Satisfie unto the Master or owner of
such Servant or Servants so carried away all such damages as he or they shall
make appear to be Justly due unto such Master or owner for want of such
Servant or Servants at the Court before whom such cause shall be tryed
Shall think fitt.

An Act for the Encouragement of the Importation of Negroes into
this Province.

Whereas Several of the good people of this Province have been discouraged
to import into or purchase within this Province any Negroes and other Slaves,
and such as have imported or purchased any such Negroes or Slaves have to the
great displeasure of Almighty God, and the prejudice of the Soules of those poor
people neglected to instruct them in the Christian faith or to endue or permit them
to Recieve the holy Sacrement of Baptisme for the Remission of their sins
upon a mistake and ungrounded apprehension that by becoming Christians
they and the issue of their bodies are actually manumitted and made fr.
