Q[u]e[n]t[u]n most Exellent Majesties by and with the advice and consent of his present
General Assembly and the authority of the same that no person or persons whatsoever
either Foreigner or Inhabitant shall buy trade or barter with any Indian or
Indians whomsoever for any flesh dead or living except one or wild fowl or
other vermin upon penalty of five thousand pounds of Tobacco the moiety to
the King and Queen for the support of Government the other moiety to the
Informer or him or them that shall sue for the same the said fine to be recovered
in any Court of Record within this Province where no Esquire protection or
wager of Law to be allowed this Act to continue for three years or to the end
of the next General Assembly.

An Act for the more speedy bringing to tryall and supressing ~~Freminaly~~
& limiting their Punishments for certain Offences when prosecuted
in the County Courts.

Whereas the Severity of the Laws of England against all theiving Stealing
and purloyning are very Inutable to that and all other populous Kingdoms
but not agreeable to the nature and constitution of this Province, somanly and
thinly Inhabited; and for the easement of the people of this Province in proceeding
against and bringing to tryall the Indivall persons guilty of the Crimes in this Act
hereafter mentioned Be it enacted by the King and Queen most Excellent
Majesties by and with the advice and consent of this present General Assembly
that it shall and may be lawfull to and for the severall Justices of the Peace
of the severall and sevperial County Courts within this Province in their
several County Courts to hear & determine all theivings and Stealings
whatsoever Robbery Burglary and house breaking only excepted whether
it be a horse, mard, gelding, foal, Cow, Calf, Ox, Bull, Stoor, Ram, Ewes, Lambes,
goates, Hogg, Digg, Sowes, or other goods or chattels whatsoever not exceeding
the value of one thousand pounds of Tobacco, and also of the severall Offences
mentioned & contained in an Act made and Enacted this Session of Assembly.
