

of such demand as w^{ill} in his or their Journall, as in the said Record of the proceedings of such Court or Courts, and that no Clerk or Clerks of any County Court or other inferior Court of Record of this Province for the future refuse or delay upon the Request of any such Appellant to write and make out transcript or transcripts of such proceedings as aforesaid under his hand and seal of the said Court as aforesaid upon penalty to pay the respective Damages & Damages which such person or persons shall sustain by such Refusal or delay as aforesaid the party appellant paying or securing such respective Clerk his Just fees for the same according to Law,

And Be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid That no Officer or Officers within this Province shall hereafter for any writ of error Superfodas or fieri facias to hear Judgment upon error from the Provinciall Court of this Province to any County Court or other Inferiour Court of this Province receive or demand any other fee or fees than is hereafter mentioned (that is to say for a writ of Error to the Secretary fifty pounds of Tobacco and to the Chancellor for the fees thereof 125^o Tobacco for a Superfodas to the Secretary 50^o Tobacco and to the Chancellor for the fees thereof 120^o Tobacco for a fieri facias to the Secretary 50^o Tobacco and to the Chancellor the fees thereof 120^o Tobacco - any Law or Laws or Customs in any wise Notwithstanding this Act to endure for three years or to the end of the next Generall Assembly which shall first

An Act concerning Negroes and Slaves.

Be it enacted by the King and Queens most Excellent Majesties by and with the advice and consent of their present Generall Assembly and the Authority of the same that all Negroes and other Slaves already imported or hereafter to be imported into this Province shall serve their naturall lives and all the children borne already or hereafter to be borne of any such Negroes or other Slaves within this Province shall be bound to all intents and purposes as their parents were for the termes of their naturall lives And forasmuch as divers free borne English and white women sometimes by the Instigation procurement or connivance of their Masters Mistresses or Dames and always to the Satisfaction of their
