aforesaid and in case any of the said Officer or Officers as aforesaid shall in
any wise Act or doo directly or Indirectly to this Act he or they so offending
shall lose and forfeit to the party grieved treble damages sustained and
shall also forfeit the sum of six thousand pounds of Tobacco or forty pounds
sterling the one moiety to our soveraign Lord and lady the King and Queen
their heirs and successors for the support of Government the other moiety
to the party or parties that shall sue for the same whom no Kings
protection or wagen of Law to be allowed Provided always That if any
fees for any matter or thing hereafter to be done belonging to the several
Officers as aforesaid and by the Governour and Councill to allowed and
adjudgd and not in this Act limited mentioned and allowed and
