

Court where the Orphan's estate doth lie shall then determine what shall be the price of the same

5. That every male Orphan shall be of full age to receive his estate from his Guardian at the age of twenty one years and not before but in case any person by his last will and Testament do appoint any person to be his Executor or Executrix that is full of age or years of age that person so appointed shall be adjudged of sufficient age to administer as Executor or Executrix and if such Executor or Executrix be under the age of seventeen years the Administration shall then be committed to such other persons as the Judge for probate of wills and granting Administration shall approve of during the minority and to the profit and behoof of the Infant Executor or Executrix and not otherwise nor in any other manner and for as much as the right to Administration of the goods of persons Intestate may fall upon persons under the age of seventeen years It is hereby declared that as they are within like reason so they are within like Law with Infant Executor &c

6. That every female Orphan shall be accounted of full age to receive her estate at the age of sixteen years or day of marriage which shall first happen

7. That all Negroes and other slaves after the transmitting the estate to the County Court as aforesaid shall be appraised to the Guardians or trustees and be preserved by them and be employed to the said Guardians or trustees up and benefit and the like number of slaves and of the like ability of body be returned to the said Orphan out of their own wages if any be at their full age by this Law limited and if any of the said slaves be grown aged or otherwise impotent or be lame, and that the owners will not make the Original stock good as to the number and ability of body that then they shall be again appraised by the said County Court and the Guardians or trustees shall pay to the Orphan so much money as the County Court shall Judge the Orphan stock of Negroes then to be of less value than they were at the time of their first appraisement and delivery of the said slaves to the said Guardian or trustee. But in case no Guardian or other person will upon these terms accept of those slaves then it shall and may be lawful for the said severall and respective County Courts to put the said slaves out upon any other terms to any other person so that the said Original stock of slaves be not sold nor
