

- any of their own as but in the best manner that may be provided for the Orphans till they come to their severall ages by this Act limited and appointed to the intent they may have their first stock made good to them in number value and ability of body if it may be
8. That all that are servants for years be likewise returned in kind to the Orphans at their full ages (that is to say) the same number of the same age and sex and the like number of years to serve and of the same ability of body as near as can be guessed as the servants were when received by the Guardian or trustee
9. Whereas every Adm<sup>r</sup> in his Inventory inserteth what debts are Separat<sup>d</sup> and what debts are Disparat<sup>d</sup> and upon account is allowed what debts are Disparat<sup>d</sup> the Judge for probat of wills shall transmit those Disparat<sup>d</sup> debts with the Division of the overplus of the Estate unto the severall and Dispersive Justices of the County Courts where the Estate shall lye to the end the said Justices may enquire whether the said Adm<sup>r</sup> have by fraud or otherwise neglected to recover the same or have recovered and never accounted for the same and shall with the residue of the said Estate commit the said Disparat<sup>d</sup> debts to the care of the Guardian or other trustee by them Employed and shall yearly and every year call the said Guardian or trustee to account for the same and duly inspect what of the said debts they have recovered or might have recovered and if the said Guardian or trustee fails to give his account yearly or by fraud or Covin neglect or forbear to recover the same the said Guardian or trustee shall stand charged with and be accountable for every such debt by them recovered and not accounted for or neglected or forborne to be recovered
10. That the Justices of the County Courts take able and sufficient security for Orphans Estates and enquire yearly of the security, and if there be Just cause that they require new and better security and upon Refusal to give new and better security to remove the Orphans Estate into better hands and further that the Justices of the County Courts shall yearly in June Court enquire by a Jury of twelve men whether the Orphans be kept maintaind and Educated according to their Estates, and whether Apprentices are yearly taught their trades or rigorously used and turned to comon labour at the age
