Be it enacted by the Authority aforesaid by and with the consent aforesaid that they shall suffer such pains and penalties as are provided by a certain Act of this Province intituled An Act for the more speedy bringing to tryall and sur pressing) Criminals and remitting their punishment for certain Offences when prosecuted in the County Courts and that all judgments that shall concern life or member that shall be made in any County Court within this Province be by the Clerk of each Prospective County Court transmitted to the Provinciale Court upon pain of forfeiture of one thousand pounds of Tobacco for every presentment by them neglected to be sent to the Provinciale Court as aforesaid.

An Act for settling of Naval Officers fees within the Province

No. 36. Whereas for some years past masters of shippes and other vessells trading into this Province have used to pay at the tyme of the clearing of such shippes or vessells for each Prospective Clearing the summe of two pounds, one shilling and four pence under protest of Secretaries fees besides other fees to diversall the Infeour Officers for writing their entries permitts and clearings which said Secretaries and other Officers fees as aforesaid were not only unreasonable but also illgall and unjust being exacted and extorted from the aforesaid Masters of shippes or other vessells as aforesaid without any protonew or colour of law or Justice whatsover but for that it doth appear to this present Generall Assembly that there is a necessity of settling fees for maintaining such Officers as shall be from tyme to tyme appointed for entering and clearing such shippes or vessells as aforesaid. Be it therefore enacted by the King and Queens most Excellent Majesties by and with the advice and consent of this present Generall Assembly and the Authority of the same that from and after the publication hereof every master of a shippes or vessell trading into this Province upon clearing his said shippes or vessells as aforesaid shall allow and pay unto their Majesties Governor for the time being the summe of forty shillings sterling and no more for such his entering and clearing and granting permitts as aforesaid their said
