

And whosoever shall cut off the ears of the said wolves head to prevent  
the receipt of tithes or other paying the same And be it likewise enacted  
by the Authority aforesaid that it shall and lawfully shall be full to and for  
the severall Justices of the severall Countyes within their respective  
jurisdiction they are hereby authorized and required yearly and  
every year during the last session of the County Court  
to raise and assess by an equal assessment upon the taxables of the said  
Countyes such summe or summes of Tobacco as the Justices of the severall  
Respective Countyes shall seem most convenient and such summes of  
Tobacco raised as aforesaid shall lay out and dispose for the purchasing  
of Duffells or Matchcoats and when the same are purchased shall deliver to  
such and so many persons desiring to purchase to the Indians as the Justices  
aforesaid shall think fit who shall render an account to the said Justices at  
the next laying out of the County Court such Matchcoats delivered him  
them have been disposed and what part thereof remains in his or their  
possession or hands, and be it enacted that such person or persons having such  
Matchcoats delivered as aforesaid be and are hereby required to deliver  
to any Indian or Indians for every wolf or wolves head not having been  
paid for before one Matchcoat containing two yards of Duffells and give  
a true account of the same at the next County Court as aforesaid to the  
Justices aforesaid and shall mark such wolf's head as aforesaid to prevent  
receipt as aforesaid
