

County Court's Due process and procedure by the first day of April  
next ensuing and at the next meeting of the Assembly aforesaid that the  
Court House of each respective County shall and may and will  
hereby be open every day in the week and as often as to them shall seem  
convenient to make and Ordain such necessary Rules and Orders for the  
well Governing and Regulating the said County Courts and the  
Officers to the same belonging and subject to the same as shall in  
their discretion shall from time to time and under such dispensation shall  
think fit not exceeding one hundred pounds of Tobacco for any one  
Officer all which sum to be employed to the relief of the poor of each  
respective County which Rules and orders so by them to be made and  
ordained shall be fairly transcribed by their several County Clerks and  
at every the County Court to be kept at the Court House door that all  
persons may view and peruse the same and regulate themselves  
accordingly And be it enacted by the Authority aforesaid that when  
any Judgment is had in any County Court for any matter or thing  
whatsoever and after such Judgment is had and obtained the party  
against whom the same is had may fly into another County out of  
the Jurisdiction of the said Court it shall and may be lawful for  
the Plaintiff to procure a Certificate from the said Justices of such  
party flying and thereupon the Justices of the Provinciall Court  
shall award Execution against the body or goods of the said party any  
Law statute or usage to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding and  
be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid that any Bills  
or other specialties Books debts or accounts proved before two Justices  
of the peace of any County or one Justice of the Provinciall Court  
and Just Credit given to the same and that the same be acknowledged  
wholly due and unpaid and certified under the hand of the said Justice  
shall be sufficient Evidence as well in the Provinciall as County Court  
within this Province any Law statute or usage to the contrary  
notwithstanding this Act to stand for three years or to the next  
General Assembly which shall first happen
