bring his action of waige against the former Guardian for the damage  
by him committed, And be it further enacted that all matters and things  
contained in the Act for the better Administration of Justice in probate  
of wills Granting Administrations recovery of legacies and pecuniary  
fieal portions and in the Law for the preservation of Orphans & all  
Estates &c by the Commissioners of every County Court in this Province  
so often as the grand Jury shall there be summoned give the same in  
charge to them and shall also overigund Court yearly and in every  
year hold a Court according to Act of Assembly solely and wholly to passe  
in execution the matters and things in this Law and the said Law for better  
Administration of Justice in probate of wills and granting letters of domi-  
nition Recovery of legacies and pecuniary fieal portions contained  
upon the penalty of five hundred pounds of Tobago daile Justice the  
one half thereof to their said Majesties their heirs and successors for
