

or twelve pence, also every french crown, piece of eight, six dollar
 at six shillings sterling, successours at seven shillings and six pence ster:
 which said four Coyne in greater or lesser pieces to be advanced as aforesaid
 also all other Coyne of silver or gold foreign or not foreign (except
 before enacted) that are or shall be licensed to be exported out of the
 Kingdom of England and passable in the said Kingdom (except base Coyne
 be paid taken and received with the advance of three pence sterling
 in the value of twelve pence sterling) in every piece proportionable
 And it is further enacted that all such moneys & Coyne so advanced as
 aforesaid shall be received and taken to the value aforesaid in all
 payments to be contracted for and paid in ready moneys under the paine
 that upon sufficient proof made of such person or persons so refusing
 to accept thereof for and in ~~confirmation~~ satisfaction of any debt due
 by bill contract or account or otherwise at such rates and advances as
 aforesaid, shall lose his or their Debt or Debts so due as aforesaid
 never to be recovered of the Debtor in any Court of Record within
 this Province or by any other means whatsoever any way or
 (custom to the contrary notwithstanding) And be it further enacted
 by the authority aforesaid that no person or persons whatsoever
 stranger or Inhabitant within this Province shall export nor
 attempt to export out of this Province any of the aforesaid
 Coyne or moneys so advanced as aforesaid under the paine of for-
 feiture of the said moneys so exported or intended to be exported
 as aforesaid one half or moiety thereof to our foveraign Lord &
 Lady the King and Queen their heirs or successours for the support
 of this Government the other half to the Informer or him or them
 that shall sue for the same to be recovered in any Court of Record
 within this Province by bill plaint or Information wherein no Ejoyne
 protection or wager of Law to be allowed Provided that nothing in this
 Act shall be taken and construed to alter the Lawes already made or
 which shall be made in reference to the Imposition upon Tobacco
 according to the Act of Assembly and four new pence per pound but that
 the same be paid in money sterling as in the Lawes directed
