

every gallon of liquor imported into this Province with intent to vend and dispose of the same thereof and send to be collected by their Majesties' Receivers generally of this Province who shall give good security to their Majesties to be accountable to the Assembly and pay the same Annually for the space of three years to the rents aforesaid on any or so many of them as the said Generall Assembly of this Province shall think fit to order and direct for the uses and purpoſes aforesaid And be it further enacted that every Major at the time of Entering of such shipps or other vessels aforesaid shall render upon Cash an account of the quantity and quality of such liquors so imported to be vendid and sold as aforesaid And that the Generall and Provinciale Naval Officers within this Province for the time being shall at the time of Entering such shipps or vessels aforesaid take good and sufficient security in their Majesties names for the payment of the Imposition aforesaid to the Receiver Generall aforesaid

An Act Prohibiting trade with the Indians or
Forasmuch as many inconveniences and mischiefs have arisen from the large and unbounded latitude taken by several persons Inhabitants and others within this Province dealing and trading with the Indians for deer Elk and Bear skins and several sorts of Furs usually and most frequently practised by people disaffected to their Majesties interest and the Government thereby also encouraging to come and draw downe several foreign and unknown Indians amongst the Inhabitants, to their great damage and prejudice in killing and destroying their stocks. Sometimes assaulting their persons and taking away in most Barbarous manner the lives of their Majesties Subjects on the frontiers of this Province for prevention whereof for the further end it is enacted by the King and Queen, most Excellent Majesties and the present Generall Assembly and the Authority of the same that from and after the Publication hereof no person or persons whatsoever Inhabitant or others residing trading or coming into this Province do presume to trade traffick barter or deal with any foreign or other Indian
