**An Act Prohibiting Trade w.
the Indians for any flesh dead or
alive except Deer & wild fowls,**

Whereasundry Complaints have been made by
Several Inhabitants of this Province, alleadging that the In-
dians under pretence of killing wild Hogs do hunt & drive
away their tame Hogs and Cattle, and do moreover sell
and Trade with the Inhabitants of this Province & likewise
with Forreigners and Strangers for beef and Pork Be it
Enacted by the King and Queens most Excellent Majesty by
and with the Advice and Consent of this present Generall ~
Assembly and the Authority of the same, that no person
either forreign^r or Inhabitant shall buy Trade or barter with any Indian or Indians whomsoever.
or persons what soever for any flesh dead or living except
Venison wild fowl or other Vermine upon penalty of five
thousand pounds of Tobacco, the moyety to the King & Queen
for the support of Government, the other Moyety to the In-
former or him or them that shall sue for the same, the said fine
to be recovered in any Court of Record within this Province
wherein no Stayn Protection or wager of Law to be allowed
this Act to continue for three years,
