

Ordinary keeper disabled or suppressed or foreaid or any
other ^{person} that shall presume to keep Ordinary without licence
first had and obeyed as afore said, shall for every Month he
or they shall keep Ordinary as afore said forfeit and pay Tenn
thousand pounds of Tobacco, one half to their Mejerher and
the other half to him or them that shall sue for the same, to be
recovered in any Court of Record within this Province by bill
plaint or information wherein no Stayn Protection or
wager of Law shall be allowed And lastly it is enacted
by the Authority afore said That the Justices of the Tre-
vinniall Court, the Commissioners of the respective County Courts
shall give this Act in Charge to the severall grand Jurys as also
to the severall Constables of the respective Courts, and the Magis-
trates of the said City to their severall and respective Constables
to Enquire into the breach of this Act and into all disorders
committed in the said Ordinaries and present the same
if any be to the said severall Courts there to be examined
and punished according to Law, this Act to continue
for three years or to the end of the next Generall
Assembly which shall first happen
