

An Act concerning what shall be allowed to the Grand Jurys that are summoned out of the body of this Province to attend Provinciall Courts.

Forasmuch as the Lawe of this Province have not as yet provided for the satisfaction of those persons that are summoned as Jurors out of the body of this Province to attend Provinciall Courts. Be it enacted by the King and Queens Most Excellent Majest<sup>ies</sup> by and with the advice & Consent of this present Generall Assembly and the Authority of the same, That these Persons that are summoned upon the Grand Jurys out of the body of this Province shall from hence forth be allowed for every Court that they shall so attend as Jurors, two thousand five hundred pounds of Tobacco for their Expences and noe more, and that every County yearly five hundred pounds of Tobacco yearly to be paid to the Chremary Keepers at f. Marie that entertains them.
