of ships or vessels or any other persons from
transporting or conveying away any persons
or persons out of this Province without Passes.

Whereas severall persons freemen within this Province
being Indebted to the Inhabitants thereof have been by
Masters of ships and other vessels transported and by others
by Land conveyed out of this Province, and also severall
servants who had time by the Custom of the Country Condition
for wages or Indenture to serve have been transported and
conveyed away as aforesaid to the great and Manifest damage
