## An Act for the Killing of Wolves.

Be it enacted by the King and Queens most ex-  
cellent Majestys by and with the advice and consent  
of this present Generall Assembly and the authority of the  
of the same That every person that shall bring the  
head of a wolf to any of the Commission<sup>ers</sup> or Justices of the  
Peace in any County in this Province shall be allowed  
two hundred pounds of Tobacco from the County where  
the wolf shall be killed and that such Commission<sup>er</sup>  
or Justice of the Peace to whom the wolfs head shall  
be brought, shall cutt out or cause to be cutt out the  
Tongue or Cutt or cause to be cutt off the Eare of the said  
wolfs head to prevent the deceit of him or of other  
paying
