An Act concerning Indians

For the end that no breach of Peace may happen
between the neighbouring Indians and the Inhabitants
of this Province Be it enacted by the King and
and Queens most Excellent Majesty by and with
the Advice and consent of this present Assembly
and the Authority of the same That any one
whosoever that shall take notice ^{Transport} or cause
to be Transported or sell and dispose of any friend
Indian or Indians what soever or endeavor or
attempt to do without Licence from the Governor
in this behalf for the time being and all Questions thereunto
shall be fined & Imprisoned at the discretion of the Gov^t & Council for the
time being, Now be it any one Informing
