 to their Majesties or others to have a Mill set up in such
 place as is foresaid, the form of which writt followeth

 Faith &c. To the Sheriff of A. B. County Greeting We
 Command you that by the Oath of Twelve honest & lawfull
 men of the County by whom the truth of the Matter
 may be better known diligently to enquire if it be by
 Damage of us or others, if we grant to N. N. of N. County
 twenty Acres of Land lying at N. in the County aforesaid
 vizt Ten Acres on one side of such run and Ten
 Acres on the other side of such run of Water to geth.
 with the liberty to take fell Cut down and carry away
 either by Land or Water, any wood or Timber fitt
 for building a Mill other then Timber fitt to be putt into
 Rap beare upon any the Lands next adjoining to
 the said twenty Acres of Land lying on each side of
 the run of Water at N. N. aforesaid in the County
