informer on to him or them that hall fue for the fame, to be recovered in any; Court of Record within this Province by Action of Debt Bill Plaint or Informati-

on, wherein no Elloyn Protection or wager of Law to be allow'd.

And Be it surther Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, by and with the Advice and Consent aforesaid, that no person or persons whatsoever so licenceed to keep Ordinary as aforesaid, shall resuse to credit any person capable of giving a Vote for election of Delegates in any County within this Province to the value of sour hundred pounds of tobacco per Annum for any accommodations by him vended, whereof any such person so capacitated as aforesaid shall have occasion of or quire to be acommodated with, under the penalty of forseiture of sour hundred pounds of tobacco, by each Ordinary keeper so resusing to credit such person as aforesaid, one moiety thereof to his Majesty his Heirs and Successors for and towards the defraying the County's charge where such sorseiture shall become due, the other moiety to the informer or him or them that shall sue for the same, to be recovered as aforesaid.

And whereas it hath been found prejudicial to the inhabitants of this Province, that fuch Ordinary keepers or Inholders have frequently entertained divers I recomen and loofe perions a great time tiphing at their Houses, as well to many other

persons great damage as their own ruin.

Be it therefore Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, by and with the Advice and Confort aforefaid, that it shall not be lawful for any such Ordinary keeper or inholder to keep such Ordinary or House of Entertainment, until they have passed before the Justices of each respective County granting their Licences a Bond with good Security to the value of twenty pound Sterling that they shall not entertain any Freeman or other loose person in their House above twenty four hours, unless such person be capable to give his vote for a Delegate in the said County, or that they be retained as a Servant to the said Ordinary keeper or Inholder, any I aw usuage or custom to the contrary norwithstanding.

And it is also hereby Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, that the Julices of the Provincial Court and the Commissioners of the respective County Court shall give this Act in charge to the several grand Jurys, and allso to the several Commissioners of the respective Courts, and the Magnitrates of the said City to their several and respective Constables to inquire into the breach of this said; and into all disorders committed in the said Ordinarys and present the same (if any be) to

the several Courts to be examined and punished according to Law.

And that all and every Act and Acts formerly made concerning Ordinarykeepers are hereby repealed and made void. This Law to continue for three years, or the end of the next Scillons of Assembly, which that first happen after the end of the said three years.

An All for sceuring the Parochial Librarys of this Province, and that the care and charge thereof le committed to some worthy and searned Per-

EITENACTED by the Lings most Excellent Majesty by and with the Advice and Confert of this prefent General Allembly and the Authority of the fame, that the Librarys appointed for the feveral and respective Parithes within this Province thali be & remain in the hands and potiestion of the Minuter of the Parish and if any Minister be prefented, appointed or inducted to the faid Parish during his residence in the Parish aforetaid, who is and shall be obliged to keep and preferve the faid Library from wast and imbazlement, & be accountable for the same to the Governour and Council and Vestry as often as required; And to that purpose the said Minister shall pass two recents for the said Books, inferting what they are, and the title and page of the fame, one receit to go to the fin-e vernour and Council, and the other to the Veitry of the Parish to be recorded in their Records, and the faid Vettrys are hereby obliged to vitir the faid Librarys twice in the year, and inspect the seme; and in case of any damage or imbezlement thereof to require and cause satisfaction to be made for the same, and in case any Minister having the charge of such Library shall be removed from his charge, he shall deliver the faid Library to the Vestry of the Parish and make farisfaction or reparation if any damage he walk suffered before his departure out of the faid. parilla
