(53) party against whom such Rule is made that special Bail shall be given be not prefent at the faid Provincial Court then the Sherif of that County where the faid party Defendant was arrested may & shall by vertue of such Rule aforesaid for special Basilto be greven take the said party into his custody again and him keep till he can procure ipaqui

Bail according to Rule of Court.

And for the greater Ease of making & taking Recognizances of such special Bail is shall & may be lawful for one of the Justices of the Provincial Court of this Province or Prefident of the County Court to take and teceive all & ev'ry fuch Recognizance of Recognizances of Bail or Bails as any person or persons shall be willing or desirous to acknowledge or make before him in his County in any Action or Suit depending or hereaster to be depending in the said Provincial Court which Recognizance shall be taken in suchmanner & form as followeth, viz.

John Doe Plaintif against Richard Ree Desendant, Tou A B & CD and either of you do undertake for the faid Ric' Roc defendant in pounds of tolacco to be levy'd a your & either of your lands & tenements goods & chattels to the use of the said john Doc the Plaintit upon condition that if the said John Doe do obtain judgment in an action of debt or trespass upon the case depending in the Provincial Court against the said Ric' Rose the Defendant that then the faid Richard Roe shall pay the condemnation or activer bini-Selt to the prison of our Sovereign Lady the Queen or you will do it for him, they asknow. ledge them! I was to be content therewith this before me day of

To the Honourable Justices of the Provincial Court

Which faid Recognizance of Bail or Bail prizes fo taken as aforefaid shall be transmitted to the Juffices of the faid Provincial Court fitting when and where fuch Act in or uit shall be depending which Recognizance or Recognizances of Bail prizes fo caken as affreiaid the faid Court shall receive upon payment of such Fees as have been received for the taking of such special Bail by the Officers of the said Court and shall be of like force & effect as if the same were taken de bene effe before the Julices of the Provincial Court during their fitting for taking of ev'ry fuch Recognizance or Recognizance nizances of Bail or Bail prizes such Justice of the Provincial Court or President of the County Court that shall take such Bail shall receive only the Sum of sive shillings and no more.

And be it surther Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, that the Justices of the Provincial Court shall make such rules & orders for the justifying of such Bailes & making the same absolute as to them shall seem meet so as the Cognizor or Cognizors or such Bail er hails be not compell'd to appear in person in the Provincial Court to justifie him or themselves.

And it is hereby further Enacted by the authority aforesaid that such Justices of the Provincial or County Court before whom any Recognizance of Bail may happen to be taken such suffice have and power is hereby given him to examin the suretys upon Cath touching the value of their respective Estates if occasion shall require any Law ufage cultom or practice netwith anding.

An Act alcertaaning the gauge of Tobacco Hoz freads.

F. it Enacted by the Queens most Excellent Majesty by & with the Advice and Not Establish to by (Lonfent of her Majestys Governour Council & Assembly of this Province and the Authority of the same, that what person or persons soever shall make or sause or Lucius fu fer to be made for his use any Tobacco Hogshead or Hogsheads which shall exceed for y eight inches in length of the flave & 32 inches in the head to be measur'd or shall make or cause or fusier to be made for his own use any tobacco hogshead or hogsheads under the fize of forty fix inches in length and thirty inches in the head, and the same hogheads or any of them shalt pack sull of tobacco shall forseit & pay the sum of one hundred pounds of robacco of which one half to her Majelly her Heirs & Succellors for the support of the Government of this Province and the other half to him or them that complain of the same and caute the same to be proved and such complaint shall be made to one or more Justice or Justices of the Peace next adjoyning, who upon such complaint shall i lucout a Warrant to the Constable of the Hundred to bring before him or them the person or persons against whom such complaint is made and the witherfes which the complainant shall name which Justice or Justices shall have full autherity by vertue of this Act to hear & determin the matter, and if the complainant shall prove his complaint before the Justice or Justices aforesaid by his own Oarh and the Oath of one sufficient evidence besides or consession of the party the said Justice or Justices of l'eace shall make out Warrant to the Sherif to levy the same by distress & fale of the goods & chattels of the party having so offended and to pay the movery to the faid complainant as aforefaid and the other moyety for the Queens use to certific to her Receiver General or the Governour for the time being.
