Do it Enasted by the Queens most Excellent Majesty by & with the Advice & Confint of her Majelty's Governour Council & Assembly of this Province & the Authority of the lame, that all persons whatsoever that are cast in any Cause be they Plaintif or Desendant shall be amere'd beside the Damage and Cost in the Provincial Court sity pounds of Tobacco to be imploy'd as the Governour & Council shall think it, and in the County Courts thirty pounds of tobacco to be imploy'd & dispos d of towards defraying the County charge in such manner as the Commissioners of each respective County shall think fit, and for the due collection thereof,
