as aforesaid, to be assessed by the said Commissioners or Jury, any thing in this Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

An Act for the dividing and regulating several Countys on the Eastern Shoat of this Province, and Constituting a County by the Name of Queen Ann's County withing the same Province.

ORASMUCH' as divers the Inhabitants of Talbet, Kent and Cacil Countys within this Province, have by their Petitions to this present General Assembly complained of the irregular sciencific, of their Countys, and the Seats of Judicature within the same, to the great inconventency's of the Suitors thereunto, for Redress

whereof for the future,

BEITENACTED by the Queens most Excellent Majesty by & with the Advice & Consent of her Majesty's Governour Council & Assembly of this Province and the Authority of the same, that from and after the first Day of May which shall be in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seven, the Bounds of Tallot County shall contain Sharp's Island, Choptank Island and all the Land on the North Side of Great Choptank River, and extend itself up the said River to Tack shoe Bridge, and from thence with a streight Line to the Mill commonly called & known by the Name of Sweatnams Mill, and from thence down the South Side of Wye River to the Mouth thereof, and from thence down the Bay including Poplar Island to the

first beginning, alf Bruff's Illand in Wye River.

And that from and after the faid first Day of May One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seven the Island called Kent Island and all the Land on the South Side of Chester River to a Branch called Sexes is Branch, and with the said Branch to the Head thereof, and from then to with an East Line to the Extent of this Province, and bounded on the Youth with Island County to Tuckahoe Bridge, and from thence with Inckahoe Creek and Cheptank River to the Mouth of a Branch falling into the said River called or known by the Name of the white Marsh Branch, & from thence with a North East Line to the Extent of this Province, & bounded on the East with the Exteriour Bounds of this Province, shall be and is hereby Constituted Founded and Incorporated into a County of this Province, and shall aid may after the said siril Day of May 1707 as afore-said, have and enjoy all Rights, Benefits & Privileges equal with the other County of this Province, such as sending Burgesses to the General Assembly, having County Courts, Sherifs, Institutes and other Officers and Ministers requisite and necessary, and as used in other Countys of this Province.

And that from and after the said sirst Day of May 1707 Kent County shall begin at the South Point of the Eastern Neck, and from thence Run up Chelepeak Bay to Saffalray River, and up the said River to the South Find of the Long Horse Bridge lying over the Head of the said River, & from thence with a Line drawn East and by South to the Exteriour Bounds of this Province, and with the Exteriour Bounds of this Province until it intersect the Line of Queen Anns County, & with the said County down Chester River to Eastern Neck where it first begun, & shall contain all the Land within

th e said Bounds.

And that from & after the said first day of May 1707 Cacil County shall contain all the Land on the North Side of Sassafrax River and Kent County, and shall be bounded on the East and North with the Exteriour Bounds of this Province, on the West with Susquehanna River and Chesepeak Bay, and on the South with Susafrax River &

Kent County.

And Be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, by and with the Advice and Consent aforesa d, that the several persons serein ascer-mentioned, no ninated & apbointed shall be and are hereby authorized, impowered and required to call to them the Surveyors of the several & respective County's aforesaid, and cause them to Run out the Lines, Bounds and Divisions of the faid Countys according to the directions in this Act before mentioned (where they are not by Natural Bounds divided one from the other) that is to fay, For Talbot County Colo' Thomas Smithfon, Mr. Rolers Gouldskorough, Major John Hawkins, Mr. Mathew-Tilghman Ward, Mr. Thomas Emer-Ion.
